Found in every student's google classroom, you will find a description of the components that must be included on the final presentation. Students will create a PowerPoint presentation using a free PowerPoint presentation tool, such as Google Slides. **ALL** students must have a 1 to 2-page final report that is typed and double spaced, using a 12" font, and in Times New Roman font. More information on the format is found in the packet.

<u>Additionally</u>, all students will be required to present their findings to a panel of at least three people, through ZOOM. The panel will consist of AECP faculty and staff, community partners, and parents. If you would like to volunteer to be on the panel, please reach out to us! Each panel member will rate the student using the same rubric found in the student's packet. Students will be assigned a specific date and time to present their findings and will be scheduled between June 13th and June 18th. Students <u>may not</u> opt out of the project or presentation. This is an end-of-year requirement for all students to move to the next grade.
